In Makueni County in southeast Kenya there is very little rain. As climate change pushes average temperatures higher and precipitation lower, drought and water scarcity are common. Many get their drinking water from unsafe sources.

It is typically women's and girls' responsibility to gather water and this means long walks to collection points. PWRDF has partnered with Utooni Development Organization (UDO) in a project to install shallow water wells with hand pumps in nine communities in Makueni County to make it easier to get safe water.

The wells are sealed, reducing contamination and protecting the community from water-borne illnesses. The wells will also drastically cut down the distance and wait time for women and girls to collect clean water, keeping them safe and freeing up time allowing them to focus on other priorities.

Training will also be provided and priority will be given to the most vulnerable communities with a plan to directly benefit 1,620 people, including 1,080 women and girls.
