## Working towards a truly just, healthy and peaceful world

### Holy goats

In Malawi, a Community Health Worker (CHW) may be responsible for the health of up to 20 families, but only receives a small stipend. In partnership with PWRDF, Partners In Health Malawi will provide three goats and appropriate training to a CHW, who will in turn be able to provide food security and additional income for his or her family.

**1 SINGLE!** Your gift of **\$80** covers one goat for a CHW.

**2 DOUBLE!** Your gift of **\$125** covers two goats for a CHW.

**3 TRIPLE PLAY!** Your gift of **\$170** covers all three goats for a CHW.

### That's a re-leaf

In rural Uganda, PWRDF partner St. Jude Family Projects is planting 80,000 trees on farms and public school properties. Trees restore the soil to better health by fixing nitrogen and preventing erosion. Fruit trees also provide avocados, oranges and mangoes, improving nutrition and providing income opportunities for families.

### The power of PPE

From 2016-2020, PWRDF's All Mothers and Children Count program empowered women and girls through improved health and food security in Tanzania, Rwanda, Mozambique and Burundi. In June 2020, PWRDF was granted a one-year extension to support AMCC partners through the COVID-19 crisis. Your donation will help supply health clinics with medical grade Personal Protective Equipment, hand washing facilities and sanitizer for community members coming in to the clinics, and education tools to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

All donations to this program are matched 6:1 by the Government of Canada.

## Gifts to grow on

### Muletide greetings

In Kenya, PWRDF partner Utooni Development Organization (UDO) is building shallow wells to provide safe, clean water to rural communities (see page 3). Some families still have to travel a distance to get to the wells. A donkey can carry four times the weight that a person can, so they are often given to older people to make the journey easier.

- 8** Your gift of **\$185** provides a strong-backed donkey to shoulder cans of fresh, clean water from the well to home.



### Poultry in motion



In Colombia, PWRDF partner ILSA empowers women to be sustainable through microfinance and organic farming. With new COVID-19 safety measures in place, rural women will learn about organic farming and how to keep chickens. As quick producers of protein-rich eggs and meat, chickens improve nutrition, food security and income.

- 9** Your gift of **\$30** supplies a group of women farmers with 5 young chickens.

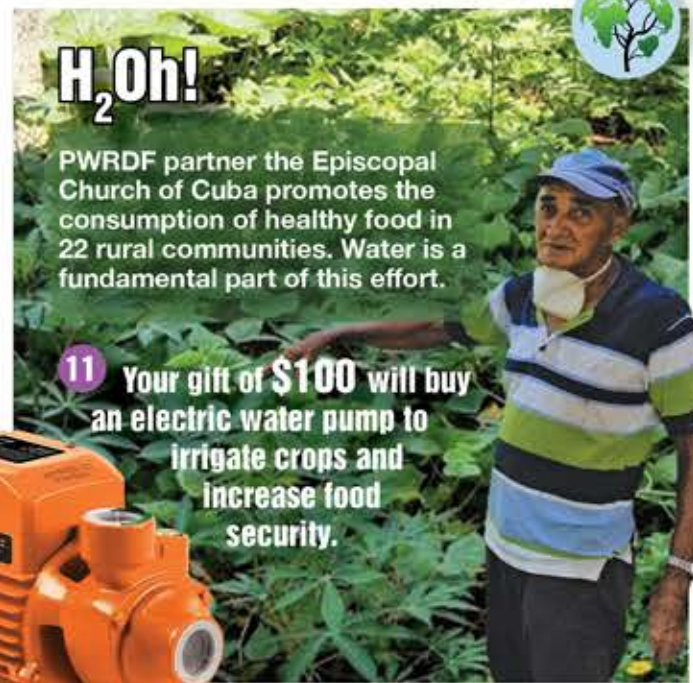


### Just add water



Hydroponics, the practice of growing plants in water instead of soil, may seem out of place in a community where there is severe drought or water is not accessible. But in fact it uses much less water than traditional farming, and it's taking root in the highlands of Colombia. PWRDF partner ECLOF is teaching this alternative method to improve food security and provide additional income opportunities.

- 10** Your gift of **\$50** supports resources for a hydroponic farmer.



### H<sub>2</sub>Oh!

PWRDF partner the Episcopal Church of Cuba promotes the consumption of healthy food in 22 rural communities. Water is a fundamental part of this effort.

### A grain of hope

Last year PWRDF began working with TSURO Trust in Zimbabwe on an agricultural education program to improve food security and learn how to become more resilient to climate change. Little did we know, they would be in the path of Cyclone Idai in March 2019.

Four ways to provide clean water

## Kenya dig it?

Last year World of Gifts raised nearly \$40,000 to support the construction of 14 shallow wells with hand pumps and one shallow well with a solar pump with PWRDF partner Utooni Development Organization (UDO) in Kenya. This year we want to provide even more clean water for rural communities in Kenya, to improve health, reduce travel time to fetch water and keep more girls in school.

## Tanks a lot

The new wells provide clean water, however, people need to be able to access the water easily. TSURO installs tanks near homes for people who can't travel far to collect water.

## Milk it for all it's worth

In Kenya dairy farming is the only source of livelihood for many families. PWRDF partner ECLOF is working with dairy farmers to help them learn environmentally friendly farming techniques to increase yields and protect the planet.

Three ways to support Indigenous communities

## Comfort and joy

The traditional Indigenous shawl (known as a *manta* or *rebozo*) is an essential tool of Indigenous midwives or *parteras* working with PWRDF partners in Peru and Mexico. Local women use colourful cotton thread to weave icons and animal figures into the edges. Midwives use them to carry herbs, ointments and oils necessary during childbirth, to relax and reposition baby during labour, to carry baby and to comfort mothers.

## Opening doors

The Nuu-chah-nulth Economic Development Corporation in B.C. empowers Indigenous youth to start their own business by providing access to capital, training and mentorship.

With a loan from NEDC, Michelle Reichert of the Peepeekisis Cree Nation launched a successful natural medicine business.

## Unmute yourself

The Páramos region of Colombia is the source of half of the world's moorlands and 70% of Colombia's fresh water. Yet climate change and mining threaten its existence. PWRDF and WACC (World Association for Christian Communication) have joined local Grupo Comunicarte to promote people-led environmental protection.

**26** Your gift of **\$100** will support weekly radio broadcasts to inform Indigenous, rural and Afro-descendant communities on environmental issues.



## The road to recovery

In refugee camps along the Thai-Burmese border, DARE (Drug and Alcohol Recovery Education) restores health and hope through active living programs. Many of DARE'S Addiction Worker Trainees are in recovery themselves and have previously been treated for their addictions. Becoming an Addiction Worker helps cement their recovery, as they help others become healthier.

**27** Your gift of **\$385** supports trainees for six months as they learn the ropes.

## In case of emergency



Since 2008 PWRDF has been a member of the Canadian Foodgrains Bank, a group of 15 church-based relief and development agencies working together to end hunger. When disaster happens, PWRDF combines funds from its equity in the Foodgrains Bank with other members' funds, and works together to provide emergency food relief in places such as Tanzania, Yemen and Zimbabwe.

Gifts to the Canadian Foodgrains Bank equity for emergency relief are eligible for up to a 4:1 match from the Government of Canada.
