Not kidding around

Community Health Workers are the backbone to healthy families in parts of rural Malawi. To supplement their small income, CHWs receive goats to breed, milk or eventually sell.

Women recovering from sexual violence in the Democratic Republic of the Congo receive training to be self-reliant and financially independent when they return home. Pigs provide a good source of protein for the family as well as income through the sale of manure and meat.

In Cuba, rural families struggle to get enough protein in their diets. Rabbits are easy to care for and provide a culturally appropriate source of protein. They also generate fertilizer that can be sold for profit.

Sowing seeds

Towards Sustainable Use of Resources Organization (TSURO) supports smallholder farmers to save seeds in eastern Zimbabwe, in a district that has recently been designated as a UNESCO biosphere reserve.

11. Your gift of \$60 will support Indigenous knowledge exchange on seed saving techniques as well as facilities for storing and transporting seeds.

Ruling the roost



TSURO also improves food security by teaching farmers to raise chickens and produce fertilizer. Chickens are protein power-houses, producing nutrient rich eggs and meat. Chicken manure is also a secret weapon when it comes to fertilizing gardens, orchards and crops.

Holy cow!


Dairy Cooperative farmers in Kenya are working with ECLOF using "smart" techniques to increase their cows' milk production and family income.

The second year of a breadfruit cultivation project with Rayjon Share Care Haiti is underway. Women are harvesting breadfruit and milling it into flour to improve local food security and earn an income.

Climate change threatens the clean water supply in Southeast Kenya, where Utooni Development Organization (UDO) provides clean, potable water to communities with the construction of shallow wells. A solar-powered pump is an efficient and COVID-safe way to draw the water.



Indigenous Responsive Grant Fund



Launched in August 2021, the Indigenous Responsive Grant Fund was designed to best meet the needs of Indigenous-led organizations. PWRDF's Indigenous Program Advisory Committee helped shape the new grant to give agency and autonomy to the way Indigenous groups use the funds. More than 340 donors supported this gift item last year, donating \$42,342. These donations, combined with general support for our Indigenous programs, totalled \$111,253. Thank you!

When disaster strikes

Climate change has increased the number of climate related disasters around the world. Floods, fires, cyclones, hurricanes and typhoons are also more devastating and unpredictable. Conflict also plays a role in triggering humanitarian crises.

Grants awarded in 2021-2022



Indigenous Peoples Alliance of Manitoba-North (IPAM-N): COVID-19 response to Indigenous communities in northern Manitoba
\$50,000 to purchase required supplies and food due to the Omicron outbreak for 15 most affected communities.

Diocese of Rupert's Land – COVID-19 response to Tataskweyak First Nation (Cree Nation)
\$15,000 to fund health and safety supplies, cleaning supplies, food and generators.



Diocese of Algoma – COVID-19 response in Diocese of Mishamikoweesh
\$12,150 to purchase and deliver food to Bearskin Lake First Nation and to purchase and deliver PPE and other supplies to Kingfisher Lake First Nation.

1 JustCity (above)

\$15,000 to fund an elder-in-residence and harm reduction programs at its three drop-in community centres in Winnipeg's core neighbourhoods.

Métis Nation of Ontario – Highland Waters Métis Council: Fireweed Learning Community Plant

\$10,000 to fund the Seed Sanctuary program that reconnects Indigenous food and farming practices to Indigenous culture and knowledge recovery.



Diocese of Edmonton – Birth Support Worker Program (Indigenous Ministries Initiative)

\$15,000 to support Indigenous people during pregnancy, birth, postpartum and into early parenting.

Kanien'kehá:ka Onkwawén:na Raotitíhkwa Language and Cultural Center (KORLCC) – Kahnawake Capacity Development for Future Generations and Community Wellbeing
\$15,000 to support local talent and capacity development for a new Cultural Village that will host KORLCC, the Community Theater and Community Museum.
