Well, well, well ... clean water for communities

Kenya is on the front line of climate change, experiencing the worst drought in 40 years. PWRDF has been supporting Utooni Development Organization (UDO) for three years in its work to improve access to clean and safe water in rural communities through the construction of shallow wells and the installation of water tanks that reduce the distance to retrieve clean water. PWRDF is continuing to support UDO for another three years, as temperatures rise, and water becomes an even scarcer commodity.

The Páramos ecosystem of Colombia is under threat from climate change, agriculture and mining. The World Association for Christian Communication (WACC) and Grupo Comunicarte are training citizen journalists to create climate-focused stories for a weekly radio program.

Getting pumped for fresh water

Access to essential resources like fresh water is increasingly limited in Haiti as political instability continues. Rayjon Share Care is supporting the Haitian Women's Federation to provide sustainable agriculture, health and economic development programs.

Changing cooking practices — and lives

In Uganda, trees are often cut down to make charcoal for fuel. Briquettes are a low-cost option made from crop residue. ARUWE is training survivors of sexual and gender-based violence to produce them in a 10-day course.

6. YOUR GIFT of \$45 funds one day of training to make briquettes, giving a woman financial autonomy and self-esteem to help restore her dignity.

Here comes the sun!

In Kenya, ADSE is providing solar-powered irrigation kits that draw water into a tank to irrigate vegetables and crops. A kit (solar panel, pump and hoses) will make it possible for 20 women and their families to improve their food security, increase income and reduce their workload.

Healing for tomorrow

With guidance from PWRDF's Indigenous Program Advisory Committee, the Indigenous Responsive Grant Fund was launched in August 2021 to respond quickly to funding needs and priorities identified by Indigenous communities and organizations in Canada. Since then, PWRDF has funded 13 projects for a total amount of \$226,150. These projects are aimed at healing intergenerational trauma, youth suicide prevention, COVID-19 response, culture and

language preservation, traditional environmental protection, teaching Indigenous knowledge practices and knowledge sharing about Indigenous food and medicinal plants.

Partnering with parteras

In rural communities of Mexico and Peru, Indigenous master midwives (*parteras*) from Kinal and Chirapaq are training apprentices in traditional Indigenous midwifery. This ensures the transmission of generational knowledge and the continuity and survival of midwifery in their communities. As a result, maternal health improves and maternal mortality rates fall.

Carrying the load

In Kenya, UDO provides donkeys to families to help them carry clean water home from the well. Strong and loyal, a donkey can also provide income by carrying water for other people, and reduce unpaid labour by children and women.

"I am grateful to UDO for empowering me with this donkey," says Elvina Kulwa, 48. Elvina sells water to the nearby shopping centre. She used to walk 45 minutes from the stream struggling with a 20-litre can of water on her back. The donkey will help her earn more income and pay for school for her six children.

A honey of a gift

In Colombia, a beehive allows women to work together to harvest commercial honey and earn an income, while the bees pollinate fruits and food crops improving the quality of produce.

Seeds of change

Moringa seeds are a source of protein, iron, calcium and vitamins B and C, but they're also a source of hope. Refugees living in camps along the Thai-Burmese border, working with DARE Network, grind the seeds into a flour that can be added to water as a nutritional supplement, Moringaid. Moringaid improves health and also improves income and long-term sustainability for the community.

In parts of El Salvador, LGBTQIA+ rights are not supported. CoCoSI brings unique education initiatives to young people to encourage them to promote respect for their human rights and foster a culture of peace.

Leading the charge

Changing harmful behaviour is only possible when people at all levels of power are part of the process. At Help Lesotho, training sessions for community leaders, teachers, police officers and healthcare providers address the culturally entrenched issues of gender-based violence experienced especially by girls and women. Through the training process, participants understand and accept their responsibility in supporting women and girls' mental, emotional and physical health and safety.
